To enable students to understand evangelism as one of the foundational principles for Christian ministry. To enable students to become reflective practitioners of evangelism in their various ministry contexts. To help students to gain insights into culturally appropriate and theologically informed approaches to evangelism and to guide them into forming their own evaluations of particular approaches to process evangelism. To encourage students to recognise, articulate and engage with questions and insight for faith raised by this module. Content: Understanding of evangelism in the context of Christian discipleship and the ministry and mission of the church. The relationship between proclamation, charism and catechesis in the context of evangelism. Methodology of theological reflection in relation to a range of approaches to evangelism. Substantial practical experience of engaging in and reflecting on the practice of evangelism in a local church.
