Aims:

This module aims to:

Provide students with an understanding of vocation from a biblical, historical, doctrinal, ecclesial and personal perspective.

Enable students to examine some ways in which the churches have expressed discipleship and ministry in the past and do so

today.

Enable students to examine how vocation can be nurtured,

explored and discerned.

Enable students to explore and reflect on their own stories of

faith and vocation, and those of others.

Content: This module examines vocation as an aspect of Christian

theology, from biblical, historical, doctrinal and personal perspectives. Areas that are likely to be explored may include:

Investigation of the ways in which vocation is understood and

expressed within the Bible and Christian tradition,

Examination of ways in which Christian churches have expressed discipleship and ministry in the past.

Exploration of how vocation to Christian discipleship and to

ministry in the church can be expressed today.

Ways in which vocation can be explored, nurtured, and

discerned in oneself and others.

Exploration of and reflection on students' own journeys of faith

and vocation and those of others.
