Module Level: 5 Module Credit Value: 10 Pre-requisites: None Co-requisites: None **Excluded Combination** TMM2101 Intermediate New Testament Greek (Extended) of Modules: Aims: To enable students to develop knowledge of New Testament Greek through reading selected passages from the New Testament text. To enable students to further develop their skills in New Testament Greek with respect to the translation and exegesis of these passages. To enable students to engage with up-to-date New Testament scholarship on the relevant texts. To enable students to consider, among other things, matters of history, literary analysis, background and theology. Content: Consolidation of grammatical learning and a systematic introduction to syntax (e.g. D. Wallace). Translation of 80-120 verses of more difficult New Testament Greek texts (e.g. 1 Thessalonians, Philippians). Discussion of theological issues that the language of the chosen texts raises.
