Skills needed to design, produce, implement and evaluate learning

activities and resources.

An exploration of the range of learning opportunities in the ministry and

mission of a local church.

The focus of this module is on generic knowledge and skills for adult learning; the module entitled *L5-10 Education and the Learning Church* in Context is designed to apply the knowledge and skills acquired in this

module to specific communities of learners.
