Aims: To equip students with the knowledge and skills to integrate biblical,

theological, ethical and missiological approaches to the environment.

To enable students to understand and analyse the causes and

impacts of selected current environmental issues.

To encourage students to reflect theologically on their learning in relation to Christian discipleship and the mission and ministry of the

church.

Content: A study of selected biblical texts, of creation theology and issues of

mission and development as part of a distinctively Christian approach to contemporary environmental issues that envisions a sustainable

future.

An analysis of some current environmental crises (such as climate change, biodiversity loss and threats to food and energy security) and an evaluation of a range of attitudes and responses to them, both

Christian and secular.

An exploration of how issues of sustainability and the environment

relate to Christian discipleship, ministry and mission.

Learning Outcomes: On completing this module students will be able to:

Give a detailed account and analysis of the causes and impacts of at least one environmental crisis of current concern, and of the questions raised by them.
