Aims:	To enable students to develop further their understanding of Christian ministry and mission in the ecclesial tradition and vocational context for, and within which, students are being prepared.
	To enable students to carry out research in profiling a community, workplace, and/or congregation, and to extrapolate implications for ministry and mission and to extrapolate implications for ministry and mission from the outcomes of the research.
	To enable students to reflect theologically on the relationship between their experience and practice in a particular context with the study of ministry and mission.
	To enable students to become critically reflective and collaborative Christian ministers in mission.
Content:	Students enrolled on this module will be engaged in a sustained placement or place of work which, together with prior experience, forms the substrate for reflection on areas of study which will include:
	The biblical, doctrinal and historical roots of ecclesiology, especially in relation to the denomination within which the student is being prepared for ministry.
	Further exploration of ministry and mission through the lenses of theology, biblical studies, the social sciences and ecclesial tradition.
	Biblical and theological understandings of leadership, authority, service and collaboration within the perspective of the church's ministry and mission.
	Students are likely to focus on these subjects in relation to their own denomination and ecclesial tradition.
