Aims: To enable students to explore and experience different approaches to

the Christian life of discipleship and prayer, their scriptural sources and historical and ecclesial contexts, including relevant approaches to these

issues from the human sciences.

To enable students to use this knowledge and understanding to reflect

upon and develop their personal life of prayer through greater

self-awareness, practical activities and disciplines.

To equip students with a spirituality that sustains and energises their discipleship and ministry / professional practice and nourishes that of

others.

Content: Investigation of practices of private and corporate prayer in relation to

their historical, ecclesial and contemporary contexts, with reference to

specific examples or figures.

Scriptural sources for models of Christian prayer, covering themes of

praise, intercession and lament.

Doctrinal aspects of prayer and spirituality, such as the Trinitarian character of Christian prayer and role of the Holy Spirit in the life of the

believer and of the church.

Skills and tools for reading the spirituality of a church or community and

for nurturing the discipleship and spirituality of others, individually and

corporately.

Practical work in the development of self-understanding and spiritual discernment and practice, through, for example, the formation or development of a 'rule of life', the keeping of a prayer diary, and the

writing of a reflection on these areas.
