Content:	Thorough examination of key texts and practices of the tradition being studied.
	Detailed outline of the historical circumstances which gave rise to and shaped the tradition.
	A study and contextual evaluation of contemporary varieties of worship within the tradition.
	An examination of the theology and spirituality expressed through the various manifestations of the tradition.
	Comparison with other Christian liturgical approaches and traditions.
