

MA in Chaplaincy Studies

1. This programme is available at Luther King Centre in full-time and part-time modes of study. Students are expected to agree their modules choices with their College Principal, and this will reflect any past study and experience together with particular requirements for the patterns of ministry and service anticipated in the future. Certain combinations of modules are excluded or are co-requisites, as detailed in the module descriptors.

It is possible for students to study and be assessed in modules to the value of 20 credits from those that are offered at Level 6 and from those offered in the biblical languages of Greek and Hebrew.

LKC offers certain modules on a rotating basis dependent on demand. Full details of those available for study are provided at the beginning of each academic year.
